LEAs that receive certain American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) grant funds through TEA must submit the ARRA Section 1512 Quarterly Report for the July 1, 2011, through Sept. 30, 2011 period by Oct. 5, 2011, at 5 p.m. Central Time.

The purpose of this program is to establish or expand activities in community learning centers that:

1. Provide opportunities for academic enrichment, including providing tutorial services to help students, particularly students who attend low-performing schools, to meet State and local student academic achievement standards in core academic subjects, such as reading and mathematics;
2. Offer students a broad array of additional services, programs, and activities, such as youth development activities, drug and violence prevention programs, counseling programs, art, music, and recreation programs, technology education programs, and character education; and
3. Offer to provide educational development.
